Duration

AHC20416 Certificate II in Horticulture runs three days a week Tuesday to Thursday 9 am - 3 pm and can be completed over a nine (9) month period with full-time study.

Training Location & Modes of Delivery

Training is conducted onsite at Tauondi College Campuses. On occasions, Tauondi may utilise off-site project work to conduct training and/or assessment.

Training is composed of practical and classroom based activities.

Entry Requirements

The eligibility criteria is vital in ensuring successful completion of the Certificate. Applicants must meet the minimum requirements for enrolment, including:

- Be a minimum of 16 years of age
- Be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- Possess a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Complete a Tauondi LL&N assessment
- Physical capabilities required to successfully complete training and assessment requirements as per qualifications

Fees

This qualification is provided to Aboriginal and Torres Strait students at no charge. However, please be aware that there are limitations on the number of qualifications a person may study under the Abstudy program. For further details please contact Centrelink in person or by phone on 132 307.

Other Costs

Students must acquire the following personal protective equipment (PPE) and/or uniforms prior to commencement of the certificate:

- Broad brimmed sun hat
- Eye protection (tinted or clear safety glasses)
- Yellow fluoro long sleeved polo shirt (must be yellow)
- Long work pants
- Steel capped boots/shoes
- Yellow wet weather fluoro jacket

Students not wearing the required PPE and/or uniform will not be allowed to participate in classes.
